Students sit and listen, and complete many reading and writing exercises. Students do not practise speaking or listening very often.*
- Students must practise using English to learn it well.
- There are many ways for students to learn English without attending a class, such as listening to music, watching movies, taking interesting classes, and finding opportunities to use English at work.
- Learning English in a classroom is worse than learning English on your own. *Everyone learns in a different way. For some students, learning in a classroom is very effective, especially if the teacher provides speaking and listening activities. However, some students can't attend classes, or they can't find a class that suits their needs. Studying English on your own allows you to study exactly what you want, when you want. So, learning English on your own is a DIFFERENT way to learn English, not really better or worse.*
